(2) Entry Categories

"Message for Peace" English section

- O A4-size free-form paper (portrait, landscape)
- O Within 2 Pages (about 500 words)
- O The First Line: the Title
- O The Second Line: the School Name
- O The Third Line: Grade and Name
- O From the fourth line: the Main Text...

(3) Prizes, etc.

- O Each school is required to send Two Excellent Works among them.
- In the "Message for Peace" English language division, One Grand Prize Winner and Two Excellence Award Winners will receive a Certificate and an Additional Prize (stationary... etc.).
- O The Grand Prize Winner will be invited to Japan with his/her 1 parent or 1 Teacher (Total 2 Persons).
